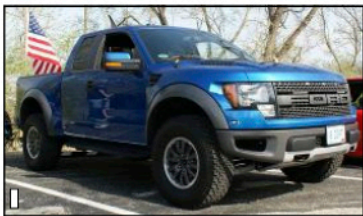
All in all, a great way to start off the 2011 car show season.
